## ART SHOW A GREAT SUCCESS

Over the June long weekend in the Wagstaffe Hall, the Bouddi Society hosted an Art Show for artists living on the Bouddi Peninsular. Despite the mixed weather, the Art Show hit record levels in Artists' paintings, woodwork, ceramics and leatherwork. It has been hailed by everyone as a great success, due in large part to the wonderful organisation and curating by Margaret Crane.

There were 26 exhibiting artists that included both painters and crafts people. Ceramics, wood turning and leather were represented.

The total sales for the show exceeded \$10,000, and there was a record level in door donations and in the purchase of raffle tickets. Overall the Bouddi Society made \$3,500 from the show.

The art show was opened by John Bell who gave a very interesting and informative talk on the history of art which began in Italy in the Renaissance period starting in the 13th century.

The big winner for the weekend was Meg Lewer from Wagstaffe who sold one of her paintings for \$1,600 and also won the 'Bells at Killcare' raffle prize.

The Bouddi Society would like to thank the exhibiting artists and the local community who helped to make this show so successful.

## Ettalong Channel Update

At last we are getting some positive news on the issue of the Ettalong Channel and opening to navigation by ferries and deep draft vessels.


The sand bar build-up has been surveyed and a design prepared for dredging works to enable a clear entrance to the channel between Little Box Head and Lobster Beach. This would be carried out as emergency works, funded by the State Government Department of Lands.

In the order of 25,000 cubic metres of sand would be removed from the bar and the channel. The location for spreading the dredged sand has not yet been advised, but is potentially just off Ocean Beach to enable natural regeneration there. The channel from Lobster Beach onwards still has sufficient depth and width as we understand. A longer term maintenance regime will need to be put in place for the entire channel to avoid a repeat of the current debacle, and Council are now engaged in this process through the "Rescuing our Waterways" program run by the State Government.

This picture, taken by Ian Bull, illustrates the area for dredging as well as the problem. Note the waves breaking over the bar blocking the channel entrance.

The scope of works for dredging has been put to tender with a view to the works themselves commencing Monday June 25.

Depending on the contractor, lead times and the weather, the works might be expected to take in the order of 4-6 weeks to complete.



Ferry services could resume shortly after conclusion of the works if the resulting channel meets all safety and operational requirements. It's anyone's guess, but we'd say this is not likely until end July or early August. We wait to be pleasantly surprised.

Local resident and engineering expert Peer Dalland is providing invaluable assistance to all parties with his insights and feedback on proposals. He has also been invited to join a Project Working Group set up by the Department. We are keeping in close touch with Peer, Council and the Department concerned in the interests of keeping our community informed and in helping to ensure those responsible do indeed work together to achieve a sustainable outcome.

Results will tell.

### Queen's Birthday Honour for Julie Dolan AM



In the 2018 Honours List, local resident Julie Dolan, received an AM for significant service to football as an administrator, player and coach, and as an ambassador for elite player development and junior participation.

Currently the Director of Sport at the International Football School at Kariong, Julie's previous awards and recognition include being awarded the Inaugural Australian Soccer Hall of Fame's "Medal of Excellence" by the Football Federation of Australia; receiving the "Medal of Excellence", for Soccer Australia, 1999 and being named the International Women's Footballer of the Century, 1998. Julie was a Matilda's Team member for 14 years, State Captain from 1977 to 1983, and again in 1986. She was Australian Captain for 5 years between 1997 and 1988 and Captain of the Team of the Decade 1979 – 1989. In her honour, the Annual Julie Dolan Medal was established for Australia's best women's soccer players annually. She holds the Australian Baggy Green Cap No.1 for Australian

Women's soccer.

She captained the 1<sup>st</sup> Australian International Test in 1979; the International Test Series in New Zealand in 1980; the 1<sup>st</sup> Oceania Cup in 1983 in Noumea; the Xian International Tournament in China in 1984; the International Tournament in Taipei in 1984 and the Pilot World Cup in China in 1989. She also completed the first Sports Science degree at the Southern Cross University which led to her lecturing and coaching in Japan at the Kanto-Gakuin University.

In 2000, she won the Queen Elizabeth II Australian Sports Medal and in 2004, she became the Inaugural Ambassador for the Under 15s Australian Representative Team. Alex Sharp
