### Beryl is still with us

Beryl Hughes was Beryl Beasley and she is part of our history. She turned 100 on 11th April this year. Beryl was most famous for her work as the cleaner at Pretty Beach Public School. She worked there for thirtyeight years.

Beryl came to Killcare with her family in the 1930s, Depression time. Their house, **Bonnie View**, was located where No.30 Araluen Drive is now. The Beasleys were better off than most because her father worked weekdays at Eveleigh Railway Workshop. There was no electricity, sewerage or town water - or many cars.

The house, *Bonnie View*, was set high on the block overlooking the bay. There were 99 stone steps up to the house. It was named by a visiting Scottish lass who exclaimed, "Oh, what a bonnie view."

Her father spent the weekends developing



the beautifully terraced garden with stone walls and steps and a lych gate (still there). It took a long time. Trees were planted in the garden by Mr Beasley to commemorate family occasions, such as birthdays, weddings and special events. A Norfolk Pine was planted to celebrate the opening of the Harbour Bridge in 1932. It invited much interest with locals and visitors.

Beryl went to Pretty Beach School and high school at Gosford: a long walk, ferry, bus and train. Beryl first worked as an usherette at the cinema in Woy Woy owned by Clarrie Riley of Rileys Bay. The Rileys had a farm on Rileys Island; she visited often because she was 'keeping company' with one of the Riley boys. She joined the Land Army during the war. The war meant more difficult years and struggling families without men. They had all joined the armed forces.

For many years she had a penfriend, Megan, in Wales whose family had decided to come to Australia. One sad day, she received a letter from Megan's husband, Emlyn, to say Megan had died so only Emlyn and his son David came to Australia and Beryl helped them settle. Ultimately, she married Emlyn in 1960. Together, they brought up David and two adopted boys, Michael and Gwynn. Life was good at Killcare. Beryl now lives with Michael and Teresa at Woy Woy. As you may be aware, we are approaching the last stage of Administration for Central Coast Council. Local Government Elections will be held statewide on Saturday 14 September at which we will be asked to vote for 3 Councillors to represent our Council Ward (East Gosford). Voting is compulsory. This means that from mid-August, Central Coast Council will be in "Caretaker" mode during which no substantial decisions can be made until the new Councillors are elected and confirmed. As such, Administrator Rik Hart will stand back during the Caretaker period, then stand down for the new Council.

It is fair to say that the period of Administration has allowed Central Coast Council (the organization) to get back on its feet both financially and operationally. The CEO and management of Central Coast Council have shown themselves to be capable and committed to effective delivery of the services we would expect day to day, but we still feel a bit neglected in our part of the world as far as more substantial maintenance and improvement works are concerned.

It will be important for us to elect 3 Ward Councillors who are passionate about the community, its services and infrastructure rather than politically focused operatives. We do not yet know who the candidates will be, but we hope to have the opportunity to meet them in advance of the election and to make our views and priorities known.

Both WTKCA and HBRG will be keen to facilitate "Meet the Candidates" sessions once the pre-election process is underway. Among other things, we will need to make the candidates aware of our interest in improvements to the Hardys Bay foreshore and progress on the associated masterplan. Community involvement and support through our elected representatives will be vital to securing competitive funding for works to address the multitude of issues we face.

As opportunities arise, we encourage community members to make their views heard by the candidates and further still once our elected Councillors are in place. We will be staying close to this process over the next three months and keeping you informed as best we can. Mike Allsop

### Pretty Beach Bushcare

volunteers always needed!

The Pretty Beach Bushcare group is seeking new volunteers to join our friendly group. We maintain Araluen Reserve, fondly named The Dog Track, which runs along the water front from the Pretty Beach boat ramp to the end of Araluen Drive, Hardys Bay. This track is gradually improving but requires constant attention.

This area is such a valuable community access and is frequently used by dog walkers, joggers and bike riders but it needs a regular injection of care and attention.

The group meets every Monday along the dog track from 2:00pm to 4:00pm to pull weeds, mulch and plant native tube stock. It is a small friendly group that is part of the Central Coast Council Volunteer Landcare program. No experience is necessary and you will learn about native plants and how to identify and eradicate weeds. Any time you can give will help to rescue the native vegetation that supports the local wild life.
