BOUDDI WILDLIFE

"Bouddi Wildlife" is a newly licensed, incorporated organisation at MacMasters Beach dedicated to protecting and rehabilitating wildlife species in need. With a strong focus on conservation and community engagement, this group aims to make a meaningful impact on the well-being of local wildlife populations on the Bouddi Peninsula.



The group has been very busy running a flight school program for orphaned flying foxes. These 'megabats' are keystone pollinators and our temperate forests depend on them. Following several extreme heat days last Summer, many pups came into care, were raised and successfully released to join the flying fox colony at North Avoca.

Knowledge is power when it comes to protecting our wildlife. That's why we're out in the community spreading the word about conservation, habitat protection, and how everyone can play a part in helping our furry and feathered friends thrive. There are a few things that you can do to help:

1) Preserve native habitat—even small bushes and fallen logs provide homes and food.

- 2)Keep cats indoors and domestic animals under
- 3) Slow down on the roads especially between dusk and dawn.
- 4) Use wildlife-friendly fruit tree netting and avoid using barbed wire
- 5) Avoid using toxic rat and snail baits

The planning process has had its ups and downs, but we understand Central Coast Council are close to a determination on the DA for this facility. After various requests for more detail, and in fact more than has ever been asked of the proponents in relation to any other site, the assessment process is now in its final phase. There has been no further public advertisement of the proposal, which is largely unchanged. Despite this, if you would like to express your views on the importance of this facility, you can make make them known to the assessment officer, Emily Goodworth Emily.goodworth@centralcoast.nsw.gov.au who will collate them as part of the history of responses on the matter.

Lastly, in a piece of good news, WTKCA were successful in our application for a grant under the NSW Government Community Building Partnership program. We will use these funds as part of our planned kitchen refurbishment at Wagstaffe Hall. Cathi Ogden & the Freddie Stafford Trio Celebrate Ella Fitzgerald at Wagstaffe Hall

Saturday, 27 July, the Bouddi Society will present a return of Jazz Singer Cathi Ogden to Wagstaffe Hall at 7 pm. The Freddie Stafford Trio joins Cathi in celebrating a jazz great.

Jazz has a habit of awakening a sense of wonder in people... a moment that first swept over local singer Cathi Ogden when she cheekily stumbled across an Ella Fitzgerald record as a 17-year-old. Cathi and her cousin borrowed a treasured record of the American jazz legend.

Cathi was then a budding jazz singer, mostly listening to Billie Holiday, Nat King Cole and his daughter Natalie Cole. But Ella Fitzgerald was something else. Says Cathi, "Everything I thought I knew about jazz changed. I was instantly in love with her voice.... that voice was like feeling her emotions. It was addictive."

The two teenagers felt guilty... but inspired. "We decided to make a mixed cassette tape anyway. I copied a recording repeatedly as each tape wore out." Years later, Cathi discovered that the album



is "Ella Swings Lightly", and she's been singing these and other songs from Ella's repertoire ever since.

Now a renowned jazz singer who has performed in Sydney, London, and New York and has released three jazz albums, Cathi will introduce to the Central Coast three talented young musicians who share her love of Ella Fitzgerald. Enter Freddie Stafford on piano, accompanied by his cohorts Jacob Graham on double bass and Tim Geldens on drums—all hailing from the prestigious Conservatorium of Music in Sydney. Freddie is still a student there, although he plays regularly in the Sydney and Newcastle jazz scenes. Plus, he's performed in Europe and the United States.

According to Cathi: "When I spoke to Freddie about doing the show and mentioned "Ella Swings Lightly," he instantly told me about his favourite tracks on the album, and we discussed the beauty of their arrangements. I absolutely can't wait to introduce these brilliant young Jazz musicians... with songs from a wide range of Ella's repertoire while sharing stories of Ella Fitzgerald's incredible life and her music." Net proceeds from the concert will support The Bouddi Foundation for the Arts and its grant program for young Central Coast Artists.

Cathi's first concert hosted by the Bouddi Society at Wagstaffe in February sold out fast. She hopes others will feel the "Ella" emotion of a live performance on Saturday, 27 July, at 7 pm. TICKETS: www.bouddisociety.org.au/jazz or at Wagstaffe Store or use QR Code.
