Our local Knit 2 Chat Too group has grown lately with new members joining us to knit crochet and sew blankets for Wrap with Love. We meet twice a month from March to November and enjoy a chat and afternoon tea but busy hands continue all year.

Members purchase their own yarn and over the years have become very creative with designs and colour combinations. Finished wraps are then taken to a Central Coast collection point then to the Sydney warehouse. We are always grateful for any donations of colourful 8ply yarn. A small group began in 2010 inspired by the ABC Knit-ins. Since then we have contributed more than 500 wraps and now are producing 70+ each year. An ex member started a group in Laurieton and visiting friends collect their wraps to add to our tally. A wonderful effort from everyone. Finished wraps are distributed by aid agencies to charities, refuges, in response to natural disasters to people in need of warmth in Australia and to countries worldwide

and to countries worldwide.

Presidents Notes August 2024 following AGM

The Wagstaffe to Killcare Community Association held its AGM in early July. Committee members duly appointed were Michael Allsop (President), Richard Urquhart (VP and Treasurer), Ian Bull (Secretary), returning committee members Martin Sieper, Robyn Warburton and Bill Gregor, with new committee members Noelene Brasche and Debbie Watson. Please feel free to reach out to any of the committee members if there are matters you would like to see addressed by the Association.

The AGM highlighted many of the Activities and Achievements of the Association during its Financial Year to end February, along with updates to date. Broadly the Association continued in its role of providing community advocacy, helping delivery of community projects and operating the community facilities of Wagstaffe Hall and Turo Park Tennis Court. The income earned from operational activities is added to reserves after expenses are deducted, and then funds in reserves can be applied to community projects. During our Financial Year we funded landscape improvements to Wagstaffe Wharf, facilities improvements for basketball and netball at Turo Park, and landscape design documentation for Killcare Surf Club Kiosk. The major fundraising events of Easter Trash & Treasure and October Book Fair were very successful in helping us build our reserves, while the Easter 2024 Trash & Treasure continued this theme.

These events all rely on volunteers from our community in various capacities, whether members of the Association or not. A huge thank-you to all who have helped. Subsequent to the end of our FY, we were advised of success in our application for a NSW Government Grant to be put towards renovations to the kitchen in Wagstaffe Hall. We will top this up with contributions from our reserves to ensure a top-quality result fit for purpose. In addition to these "operational" activities, the Association continued its advocacy for the amenity of the community more broadly. We had several particular achievements including the introduction of a shuttle ferry service during dredging operations, revised ferry timetable, and sealing of Albert St Wagstaffe. We continued to advocate for the approval of the proposed mobile comms tower at Killcare Heights, the improvement of the Empire Bay Drive/Wards Hill Road intersection and the reconstruction of the Half Tide Rocks Track.

We continue to lead the development of a Hardys Bay Foreshore Masterplan as a co-operative effort with the Hardys Bay Residents Group and a splendid group of local urban design, planning, architecture and landscape architecture professionals. This has included briefings with senior officers and directors in Council as well as several local community workshops, resulting in formal documentation of a very high standard. The immediate next phase is to be undertaken by Council itself, who have committed to a program of wider community consultation prior to refinement and adoption of the plan. A program of individual improvement projects would follow over the next few years. Without planting this seed, nothing would have happened, and the dilapidation of our foreshore and adjacent roads would have continued unaddressed and pedestrian safety and accessibility remained ignored. The Association will continue to advocate for the execution of these projects in years to come, along with the support of our political and new council representatives.

Our Guest Speaker at the AGM was to have been Jeremy Cox talking on the Electrify Bouddi initiative. Unfortunately, he was delayed out of town but forwarded presentation materials to Mike Allsop, who presented on his behalf. This initiative is being well supported in the community and WTKCA are pleased to offer a further forum for it to be pursued. We look forward to more of their events upcoming. Indeed, WTKCA maintain relationships with groups across the community to provide mutual support wherever possible in forms that are most appropriate. Stay in touch!

Electrify Bouddi is a not-for-profit community association for Bouddi residents and local businesses who want to reduce their climate impact, build climate resilience and save money on energy. We generate and share information, knowledge and guidance to develop individual and communitylevel energy solutions.

Currently, on the Bouddi Peninsula only 19% of households have rooftop solar, well below the national average of 40%. Electrify Bouddi aims to double the number of solar rooftops in Bouddi over the next two years.

Most homes can save up to \$40,000 over the life of new solar panels. Advances in solar technology mean that many houses considered too shaded can now take advantage of solar power. Solar is now cheaper and easier than ever to install, particularly with government rebates.

Water heating is responsible for around 28% of our carbon emissions from the home, so changing how we heat water is also one of the easiest ways to reduce emissions and energy costs at home. To help Bouddi residents reduce energy bills and greenhouse gas emissions, we have put together resources on our website - www.ElectrifyBouddi.org - to help you install solar panels and to find the best hot water solution for your circumstances. We have also listed some reliable, local solar suppliers to get quotes for panels.
