

#### **President's Notes**

By the time you read this we will have newly elected councilors in place for Central Coast Council. We had the chance to meet some of the candidates for our Ward at Wagstaffe Hall in mid September and over 120 local residents joined in the occasion. We hope the newly elected body will learn the ropes without delay and begin to operate in a collegiate manner. The mayor as elected by them will need to establish a sound working relationship with the CEO and contribute positively to the effective operation of the day to day business and its improving financial position. Much is yet to be done for the long term. WTKCA will look to establish good rapport with the 3 councilors elected to our Ward and we look forward to a first meeting with them.

During the month of October Central Coast Council will be running a Community Consultation Program to collect your views in relation to the Hardys Bay Foreshore all the way from Rocky Point in the east to the Pretty Beach boat ramp area in the west. They will be focusing on issues and opportunities for improvement as identified by you. The program will be on-line where you can nominate locations and make notes on a map, adding to others if you wish. The program will also include two drop-in sessions at the Hardys Bay Community Church where you can discuss your thoughts with Council officers and also with members of the local Masterplan Working Group. Each resident will receive a flyer describing the program and these arrangements, and we encourage you to participate.

After results of this first round of consultation have been analysed, the Masterplan Working Group will accommodate any variations to the current thinking and then prepare a concept plan for final consultation through Council. We are looking forward to this level of engagement with our wider community and are very pleased that Council has picked up the process. At the end of the day, a Masterplan is essential to any applications for State or Federal funding for the various projects needed to improve the foreshore. Lets make it happen.

On another note, congratulations to all the local artists who are participating over the long weekend in both the Art Show at Wagstaffe Hall and the Bouddi Peninsula Arts Trail. This is always really enjoyable and we appreciate the effort you and the various organisers put in to make this a great feature of the weekend.

Lastly a reminder that WTKCA will be holding its annual Book Fair in early November. The sale will be at Wagstaffe Hall on Sat 2 and Sun 3 November (i.e. over 2 days), with donations accepted the Friday prior. Get sorting, see you there!

Long Weekend 5-6 October 9.00am – 4.00pm


# Work by 27 local artists will be showcased

### Plan a Bouddi Peninsula Arts Trail Weekend

The beautiful Bouddi Peninsula is home to some amazingly talented artists and the annual Bouddi Peninsula Arts Trail is a unique way to connect with them. Meet artists in their studios or workshops and catch a glimpse of how and why they create their artworks. The inspiration provided by the beautiful Bouddi National Park, tranquil bays and surf beaches means many of the works reflect the stunning local environment.



This October Long Weekend, a diverse group of 21 local artists from Killcare Heights through to Wagstaffe are once again opening their studios. Their work includes water colour, oil and acrylic painting, photography, natural fibre work, woodwork, ceramics, printmaking, mixed media, sculpture, canvas and leatherwork, and silver jewellery.

Open studios will be flying a red flag and you can follow the Bouddi Peninsula Arts Trail map to find them. Spend a day, or two, visiting the studios and stop in to our local shops and eateries to recharge your batteries. There really *is* something for everyone.
